AUDIT OF ST. MARY MAKES RECOMMENDATIONS

State Auditor's office

JEFFERSON CITY -- The Missouri State Auditor, Susan Montee, has completed a petition audit of the city of St. Mary.

The audit lists two findings:

"The Board does not sign the detailed list of bills approved for payment. In addition, a copy of the detailed list is not retained with meeting minutes. As a result, it is not clear which disbursements were approved since the official meeting minutes simply indicate the Board approved the payment of bills"

"The city ordinances are not well organized, and the city does not maintain a summary list of ordinances passed, rescinded, or superseded by a subsequent ordinance. As a result, it is not clear which city ordinances are currently in effect."

Saint Mary Board of Alderman approves 4-0 Mayor's request to send out a newsletter from the Mayor to update residents on the water and sewer project.

Included will be ordinances passed by the board. Mayor Wyatt said the newsletter would be non political and would have to have the entire board's approval before sending it out.

In 2009 Mayor Barnett promised if elected he would update residents about the city's progress or lack of in the Grapevine newsletter and to include it back with the water and sewer monthly bills. The board rejected this 3-1. Once Mayor Wyatt was appointed, he banned the newsletter from city hall. The Sainte Marie's Grapevine is pleased that the mayor and board see the value in communicating with the fine residents of Saint Mary!
